25 years ago, average yields would be around 7-8000kg, with 10,000kg being the holy grail, but the improvements in livestock genetics

> has increased this to 12-14,000kg, with many more cows now reaching 100,000kg in their lifetime.

Dale's Diary

Grass staggers - do not run the risk

If you are turning out to grass don't forget GRASS STAGGERS. Just because you have not seen it for several years does not mean it will not appear again. Look out for nervous, fidgety cows, which indicates borderline staggers or in other words a shortage of magnesium.

Options:

- 1. Add Cal Mag to any buffer feed (minimum 50gms/head/day)
- 2. Increase magnesium level in your mineral
- Place MEGALIX Quattro Mag tubs out in the fields Avoid the risk

- 4. Add Mag chloride flakes to water supply
- 5. Talk to your local Scotmin expert

Obviously grazing will feature as a key to milk production this year especially with continued low milk prices. However, do not overestimate the production possibilities of grass as this can lead to a multitude of problems including an increased risk of grass staggers.

PRODUCTION GUIDELINES FROM FORAGE

| Production From Forage (Lts) | Forage Quality | Description |
|--|----------------|---|
| Maintenance + 5 litre milk production per/day | Poor | Mature grazing |
| Maintenance + 10 litre milk production per/day | Medium | Late summer grazing Overgrazed grass <3cm |
| Maintenance + 15 litre milk production per/day | Good | 4–6cm decent grazing (spring/summer) |
| Maintenance + 20 litre milk production per/day | Excellent | 8–10cm young, spring grazing |

Buffer feeding will be required where production outstrips grass capabilities, but it is essential the buffer is designed to balance grazing.

| | Grazing | Grazing + forage | Grazing + forage + brewers grains |
|------------------------------|---------|---------------------|---|
| Effective stocking rate (ha) | 5.8 | 11.6 | 11.6 |
| Milk Yield Lts | 18.7 | 14.6 | 18.9 |
| Fat% | 3.73 | 4.21 | 4.03 |
| Protein% | 3.73 | 4.21 | 3.29 |
| Total DMI (kgs) | 14.3 | 13.7 | 15.8 |

This table reflects several research studies but shows how important it is to get the balance right on the buffer feed if it is going to work properly and not just substitute grazing.

So, the key messages are:

- Don't forget grass staggers
- Supplement with magnesium accordingly
- Assess grazing production accurately
- Balance buffer feeds correctly
